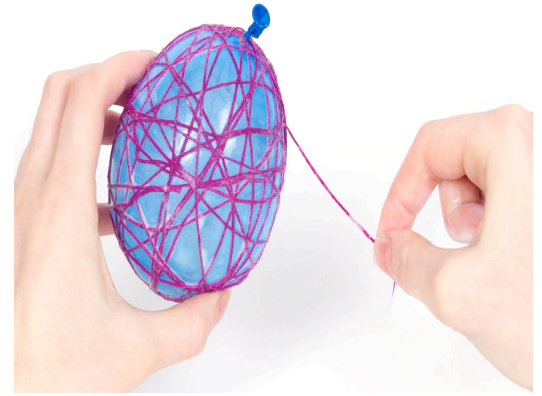


## String/yarn eggs

Make a glue paste with equal amounts of flour & water. Cut 3m of wool or string and place in flour paste, mix around then wrap around partially inflated balloon, removing excess glue as you go. Leave to dry for a day or so until hard. Pop balloon.

You now have an egg to put in your nest!!

## Make a string bowl



You will need:

Small bowl upturned & wrapped in clingfilm  
Flour paste ( see top ) OR PVA glue mixed with water to make runny  
Lengths of string or wool  
Just like the egg activity above, wrap the gluey string or wool around the base of the bowl.  
Press firmly & leave for 2 days to dry before removing carefully
