## Thought for the Day –1<sup>st</sup> September 2020

As the new month of September begins, it seems more than ever to mark a time of preparation, change and new beginnings. The new school year brings mixed feelings of joy and anxiety for children, parents, and teachers alike as classes return to as near a normal education as possible. The new Methodist year comes with added challenges of making our church buildings safe for a return to worship 'in body and spirit'.

I wonder what the Apostle Paul would make of all that is going on? No doubt his letters would have taken on a different flavour had he been writing, not from a prison cell guarded by Roman soldiers, but from self-isolation amid a pandemic! Here's my take on that famous passage from Ephesians, trading the military armour imagery that would have been familiar in Paul's world for something more up to date...

## The Personal Protective Equipment of God

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on all the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole PPE of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the facemask of truth, and having put on the gown of righteousness, and, as gloves for your hands, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances use liberally the hand-soap of faith, with which you can extinguish all the infections of the evil one; and take the face-shield of salvation, and the disinfectant-spray of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.
