On 23rd June at 10a.m. our worship will be led by the Rev Canon Jason Vinyard; this service will include a celebration of Holy Communion. The communion offering will be for Bury Town Pastors with envelopes and forms available for Gift Aid.

The service on 30th June at 10a.m. will be presented by the church stewards.
