Old Testament Reading Genesis 37 : 1 – 4 and 12 – 28

Jacob lived in the land where his father had stayed, the land of Canaan.

² This is the account of Jacob's family line. Joseph, a young man of seventeen, was tending the flocks with his brothers, the sons of Bilhah and the sons of Zilpah, his father's wives, and he brought their father a bad report about them.

³Now Israel loved Joseph more than any of his other sons, because he had been born to him in his old age; and he made an ornate^[a] robe for him. ⁴ When his brothers saw that their father loved him more than any of them, they hated him and could not speak a kind word to him.

Joseph sold by his brothers

¹² Now his brothers had gone to graze their father's flocks near Shechem, ¹³ and Israel said to Joseph, 'As you know, your brothers are grazing the flocks near Shechem. Come, I am going to send you to them.'

'Very well,' he replied.

¹⁴ So he said to him, 'Go and see if all is well with your brothers and with the flocks, and bring word back to me.' Then he sent him off from the Valley of Hebron.

When Joseph arrived at Shechem, ¹⁵ a man found him wandering around in the fields and asked him, 'What are you looking for?' ¹⁶ He replied, 'I'm looking for my brothers. Can

you tell me where they are grazing their flocks?' ¹⁷ 'They have moved on from here,' the man answered. 'I heard them say, "Let's go to Dothan."'

So Joseph went after his brothers and found them near Dothan. ¹⁸ But they saw him in the distance, and before he reached them, they plotted to kill him.

¹⁹ 'Here comes that dreamer!' they said to each other. ²⁰ 'Come now, let's kill him and throw him into one of these cisterns and say that a ferocious animal devoured him. Then we'll see what comes of his dreams.'

²¹ When Reuben heard this, he tried to rescue him from their hands. 'Let's not take his life,' he said. ²² 'Don't shed any blood. Throw him into this cistern here in the wilderness, but don't lay a hand on him.' Reuben said this to rescue him from them and take him back to his father. ²³ So when Joseph came to his brothers, they stripped him of his robe – the ornate robe he was wearing – ²⁴ and they took him and threw him into the cistern. The cistern was empty; there was no water in it. ²⁵ As they sat down to eat their meal, they looked up and saw a caravan of Ishmaelites coming from Gilead. Their camels were loaded with spices, balm and myrrh, and they were on their way to take them down to Egypt.

²⁶ Judah said to his brothers, 'What will we gain if we kill our brother and cover up his blood? ²⁷ Come, let's sell him to the Ishmaelites and not lay our hands on him; after all, he is our brother, our own flesh and blood.' His brothers agreed.

²⁸ So when the Midianite merchants came by, his brothers pulled Joseph up out of the cistern and sold him for twenty shekels^[b] of silver to the Ishmaelites, who took him to Egypt.

New Testament Reading

Matthew 14 : 22 – 33

Jesus walks on the water

²² Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. ²³ After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone, ²⁴ and the boat was already a considerable distance from land, buffeted by the waves because the wind was against it.

²⁵ Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. ²⁶ When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. 'It's a ghost,' they said, and cried out in fear. ²⁷ But Jesus immediately said to them: 'Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid.'

²⁸ 'Lord, if it's you,' Peter replied, 'tell me to come to you on the water.'

²⁹ 'Come,' he said.

Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came towards Jesus. ³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, 'Lord, save me!'

³¹ Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. 'You of little faith,' he said, 'why did you doubt?'

³² And when they climbed into the boat, the wind died down. ³³ Then those who were in the boat worshipped him, saying, 'Truly you are the Son of God.'

Reflection

Today we read two more very familiar stories. First we turn to our New Testament reading which follows on from the bread and fishes last week. So imagine yourself there. Having lived through the most eventful of days Jesus sends you off in a boat. Very early next morning the boat is being buffeted by the rising storm, the timbers groan, the waves crash over the sides, fear is in your stomach. Now you see a distant figure looming through the storm, walking on the surface of the lake. You recognise him and jump out of the boat and walk across to him, but suddenly you lose focus on who is in front of you and instead you see the chaos of the world all around you and you begin to sink. Jesus' hand reaches out to you and leads you back to the safety of the boat. God saves! Even when our faith falters our God does not falter. We live in that chaotic world today. Are we able to keep our focus on God or is our priority the world in which we live?

Both of our readings remind us of a saving God who is there in all situations. In our Old Testament reading, the beginning of the cycle of Joseph stories, it does not mention God, however we see the faithfulness and providence of God. This is a God who would ensure that this young favourite son, who was despised by his siblings, would be saved. Things would have turned out very differently if it had not been for the watchful eye of the one who called Israel into being.

Both of these stories talk to us of the inexplicable wonder of God's redeeming love. Conversely, they also talk to us about our faith and our calling. Dietrich Bonhoeffer's classic analysis of Peter's response says "Peter had to leave the ship and risk his life on the sea, in order to learn his own weakness and the almighty power of his Lord. If Peter had not taken the risk, he would not have learned the meaning of faith.... the road to faith passes through obedience to the call of Jesus."

This is not a story of the sceptic who habitually doubts, but the story of the faithful follower who begins to lose his nerve when he discovers the odds stacked up against him, but who from Jesus finds a steadying, delivering hand.

We may find life difficult, maybe we think life is stacked up against us, but that steadying hand is there for us to reach out and hold; Jesus' hand. Remember even when we are surrounded by scary or distressing things that we are beloved of a God who has been faithful to God's people

Draw close with faith, hear him calling your name and know the saving love of a God who is with us in all situations. God saves!
