Gospel Reading: John 20: 19-31 Jesus Appears to the Disciples

of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' ²² When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

²⁴ But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

²⁶ A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' ²⁸ Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' ²⁹ Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Reflection: By Rev Rita Carr

This week we have the familiar story of Thomas or as he has become known 'doubting Thomas'. We live in sceptical world where seeing is believing. And so, the story of Thomas wanting to reach out and touch Jesus makes sense to us, because we too can understand why he needed proof. It was probably quite frustrating for Thomas at the time. He had not been with the other disciples when Jesus first appeared to them. I expect he felt that very human emotion of disbelief. How many times have we missed the main event and only had to rely on the testimony of others. How we wished we had been there. Thomas was adamant that unless he saw, touched, and felt Jesus then it wasn't true. How could he believe in something he had not seen for himself?

For us Christians we have to be able to do the exact opposite to Thomas. For us believing leads to seeing. This is an act of faith. That is what our faith in Christ Jesus is founded on. We see because we believe. I wonder what Thomas might have thought of that. If we could have a conversation with him and tell him that even though we haven't seen Jesus in the flesh we have begun our journey of walking with Jesus, that we have seen the light.

This puzzling story reminds me of the animated film Polar Express with the conductor voiced by Tom Hanks. In one scene the conductor says these words 'Seeing is believing, but sometimes the most real things in the world are the things we can't see'. This really resonates with us today and how we come to know Jesus. When we live each day with the assumption that there is a good and loving God, changes can take place. We become aware of purpose in life and we are better people for it. Jesus made it clear to Thomas that proof was a privilege and not a right. Jesus knew that by appearing to Thomas the word of his resurrection would have greater meaning and Thomas would spread the word, shout from the rooftops even, that Jesus was alive. And after more than 2,000 years Thomas can still share this story with us today. There is a Saviour, He is Risen and He is alive. With that belief forming the basis by which we live, and just as Thomas reached out and touched Jesus we will be able reach out our hand and see Jesus for believing is seeing. Amen.
