Bible reading: John 6: 24-35

So when the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum looking for Jesus.

When they found him on the other side of the lake, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.' Then they said to him, 'What must we do to perform the works of God?' Jesus answered them, 'This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.' So they said to him, 'What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat." 'Then Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.' They said to him, 'Sir, give us this bread always.'

Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

Reflection by Josie Keys

One of the most memorable stories about Jesus which has come into our national consciousness is "the feeding of the 5000". In fact Jesus fed great crowds of people on more than one occasion and we puzzle how thousands could be satisfied by 5 loaves and 2 smoked fish, the contents of one boy's lunch box. One of these occasions is told in the verses which come just before the reading set out here. What a busy and tiring event that must have been: imagine Glastonbury Music Festival or maybe your church Christmas Fayre. The next day there is a feeling of anti climax and the workers at the event just want to relax after the clearing up is done. So our reading today is about the morning after the night before and it begins with Jesus and his men leaving for a break, but the crowd still wanted more from them. This great feast had been good – "let's do it again" they think. They chase after Jesus by boat following him to the other side of the lake.

I can imagine Jesus heaving a resigned sigh as he sees people climbing out of their boats on the shore; being Jesus, he understands their motives – they want to see another miracle, they want more bread like yesterday. Jesus gives them a sermon in a sentence: "Do not work for food that goes bad instead work for the food that lasts for eternal life...." (v.27)

"What do you mean? What must we do then to please God?"

"Only believe: believe that God sent me to feed your hunger". There is a hidden meaning here in Jesus' words, because those people, like us perhaps, are hungry not only for lunch but for a meaning in life. Jesus knows they are well acquainted with the story of their ancestors being miraculously fed with manna in the wilderness and he taps into this knowledge: "It wasn't Moses who gave you that food but God in heaven who provided for you with the bread that gives life".

"Give us this bread then", they say and Jesus replies with 6 small words which have a huge meaning:

"I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE"

In his gospel John reports things which he calls "signs of God's Kingdom" and this saying of Jesus is one such sign. When you believe in Jesus and trust that he is God's Son on earth, then he is near you, you live under God's reign, in God's family. He will supply your every need, not just your wants. More than the daily sandwich for lunch or toast at breakfast, Jesus can fulfil your needs and satisfy your spiritual hunger.

An old hymn - "Fight the good fight" (somewhat outdated sentiments, of course) ends like this: "Only believe and thou shalt see that Christ is all in all to thee". Today we will sing "Break thou the bread of life dear Lord to me" which not only sees Jesus as the bread which satisfies but also as the Word – the Word of which John wrote at the start of his Gospel: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God".

We find Jesus the Word within the word of scripture which can open our eyes to the feast of truth and light which is Jesus and which feeds our spirits with heavenly bread. That does not mean we will never go hungry again but it does give assurance of a sustaining presence in our life.
