Gospel Reading: Mark 7: 24-37

Jesus honours a Syro-Phoenician woman's faith

²⁴ Jesus left that place and went to the vicinity of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know it; yet he could not keep his presence secret. ²⁵ In fact, as soon as she heard about him, a woman whose little daughter was possessed by an impure spirit came and fell at his feet. ²⁶ The woman was a Greek, born in Syrian Phoenicia. She begged Jesus to drive the demon out of her daughter.

²⁷ 'First let the children eat all they want,' he told her, 'for it is not right to take the children's bread and toss it to the dogs.'

²⁸ 'Lord,' she replied, 'even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.'

²⁹ Then he told her, 'For such a reply, you may go; the demon has left your daughter.'

³⁰ She went home and found her child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

Jesus heals a deaf and mute man

³¹ Then Jesus left the vicinity of Tyre and went through Sidon, down to the Sea of Galilee and into the region of the Decapolis. ³² There some people brought to him a man who was deaf and could hardly talk, and they begged Jesus to place his hand on him.

³³ After he took him aside, away from the crowd, Jesus put his fingers into the man's ears. Then he spat and touched the man's tongue. ³⁴ He looked up to heaven and with a deep sigh said to him, *'Ephphatha!'* (which means 'Be opened!'). ³⁵ At this, the man's ears were opened, his tongue was loosed and he began to speak plainly.

³⁶ Jesus commanded them not to tell anyone. But the more he did so, the more they kept talking about it. ³⁷ People were overwhelmed with amazement. 'He has done everything well,' they said. 'He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.'

Reflection by Rev Rita Carr

The gospel reading for today, shows us a feisty woman who argues with Jesus. I am sure He would have been taken aback by her persistence. Jesus would have felt drawn to minister to the people he knew and worked and lived with, the Jewish people of his time. But instead of welcoming him and his ideas the Jewish religious leaders were suspicious of him, and at times confrontational.

Here we see Jesus wrestling with the tension of the Jewish people and the Gentiles. Jesus wants to

bring the message of God and the Good News of God's grace to the children of God, the Jews. However, time and again he sees that the people who really get him are not the Jews but those who are often deemed to be outsiders. This could be due to their gender, race, traditions or health. It seems to be these people who actually grasp what he stands for and how he is trying to get his message across. They understand him and challenge him.

The way Jesus speaks to this woman seems off hand even harsh at first. But her persistence pays off and Jesus recognises that she is wise and understands what he is about. Sometimes it takes those on the outside to see what's happening on the inside. In part, the prophecy of Simeon is met in this encounter (Luke 2: 29-32). Jesus becomes for this woman 'a light for revelation to the gentiles...' as he shares with her something very personal. He offers healing to her child which she has longed for. In this act Jesus embraces the gentiles. The woman must have been overjoyed when she returned home to find her daughter cured. Her quick-witted wisdom brought God's healing grace to her daughter. I was quite young when I first became a mother, but that fighting instinct was there from the beginning. I would do anything for my children to protect them or get them the care they needed when they were ill. I can relate to this story of a woman desperate for healing for her child. So desperate that she was willing to go head-to-head with Jesus.

This is another example that sees Jesus interacting with those on the margins of society. Here we see Jesus is deeply moved by the woman's faith. The woman is certain that God doesn't have favourites and there is always enough of God's provision for all. This reading shows that faith changes the way we live. **Amen**
